Vocational Services – Bob Wright

- July Present Citizenship Awards to twenty pupils in ten schools. Each pupil will receive a certificate and a £25 book token.
- October Start Mock Interviews with year 11 Smithdon High School. We hope to interview approximately 150 children.
- April'17 support Trinity King's Lynn Club with Crucial Crew.
- May'17 Present Centenary Award at Smithdon High School to 3 students.
 Consisting of Certificate and £250 (1st), £100 (2nd), £50 (3rd) to go towards their further education.
- We are investigating a project undertaken by other Rotary Clubs with regard to setting up a cookery competition for High School Children. We will be talking to Smithdon about this in due course. Young Chef and Foodbank.
- Investigate the potential of a Smithdon based Interact Club.

International and Foundation – Janet Eastwood

- The intention is for International Service to continue to work together with Foundation under one committee because of several common aims.
- Continued support will be given to :
 - i) The polio campaign to help to remove the virus and disease from the planet. RHS Bloom Groups End Polio Now
- (ii) Aquabox and Shelterbox.
- (iii) If still required, the Rotary Club of Downham Market to help in the recuperation of the injured resulting from the Chernobyl nuclear disaster.
- iv) "Lend with Care" will continue under the supervision of Adrian Evans and Smithdon Staff.
- v) Other charities with assistance given from the disaster fund as appropriate.
- The Club will continue to promote education, literacy and health in developing countries with the help of relevant grant applications.
- Organise Fund Raising Events to raise Foundation contributions and Global Disaster funding (e.g. Poetry Night, Music Night)
